Hard to believe that finals' time had rolled around already as we made the trip down North Road to Hurlingham Park, East Brighton. As the heavens opened upon us there was no sign of spring in the air, yet the closer we got to the venue, the more the outlook improved and by the time we exited the car the skies were clear and the tension in the crowd for the preceding game indicated that the stakes were high.

We were to take on Ormond who we had failed to register a win against in the Home and away fixture. We had our chances in our first meeting, and our second meeting saw us comprehensively beaten. Despite these results, my feeling was that if we were to play at our best, our continued improvement would see us right in this contest.

The first bounce saw us immediately have an impact with a strong clearance from our midfielders putting us deep into attack. This was the area of our

game that we had targeted as pivotal to us achieving success and the tone had been set. We controlled the first half of the quarter continually pushing forward and putting the Ormond defence under extreme pressure. At all parts of the ground, we continually harassed and pressured our opponents taking away their time and space and not allowing them to play the possession game that they had great success with in our prior meetings. As the quarter wore on it was again our ball use going forward and our shots on goal that were starting to hurt. Despite our efforts in general play we weren't converting goals. Ormond then showed what they were capable of by themselves stringing together some brilliant passages of play, with clean ball handling and quick ball movement providing their forwards with some clean opportunities. They also worked well in numbers to win the ball and to get it to those that had time and space. In short time, they had made up the deficit and managed to post a 1 point advantage at the 3/4 time break. The arm wrestle was to continue!

It was clear from the outset of this game that neither side would be willing to wilt and that it would be the little moments that would be decisive in which team was to collect the spoils. It was Ormond that started the quarter with renewed urgency. They were to win the first couple of clearances and eventually they goaled putting a small break on the Hawks. The Ormond players were again starting to find space in dangerous positions and it was beginning to look like our boys, who had given their all, were starting to run out of petrol. Much to the delight of the Hawks' faithful, we couldn't have been more wrong, as again our boys rallied and began to exert real influence on the game. We continually pressed forward pumping the ball into our scoring zone. It is probably fair to say that again our system and ball use wasn't great, but our work rate and endeavour was through the roof, Ormond was under real pressure! The guarter wore on with the result in the balance when our opponents pressed forward and found the footy once more under intense pressure in their pocket on the boundary about 45metres out. Our tackle on the Ormond player was high and a free kick deserved, but to our disappointment the umpire also deemed the tackle late.
