Dealing with Incidents on Match Day

Over the course of this season we have had some incidents involving our teams where members of our club have approached opposition officials on match day or have subsequently directly contacted the SMJFL or an opposition club.

The club would like to remind you all that if you are witness to any on-field incidents or inappropriate off-field behaviour from players, coaches, officials and/or or spectators that you deal with it through the correct channels by bringing it to your team managers attention. It is not appropriate for parents to approach opposition officials or players on match day. If you feel that the incident has not been satisfactorily resolved on the day then you should bring it to the attention of the club's match committee and/or executive who will then follow-up and have the matter reported to the league or raised with the opposition club if required.

It is not appropriate for players, parents or supporters to communicate directly with the Southern Metro Junior Football League or opposition clubs at any time or to approach umpires or opposition match officials on match day.
