FROM THE (VICE) PRESIDENT...



If the season was a football game, we would be entering the last guarter. Just like what can sometimes happen on game day, and the business end being that last quarter, things around the club and indeed the league, seem to step up a notch. This season is no different. With a number of events now behind us, such as Inter league and Representative commitments, school holidays, school camps and trips, as well as general absences due to other reasons, for the most part, we are nearing full strength both on and off the field as far as the club as a whole is concerned.

There is lots going on behind the scenes on a number of fronts that I would like to touch on, in a bid to keep you all informed about your club. Let's start with the two venues we have as our playing and training facilities. Firstly, Columbia Reserve and the clubrooms. As has been reported on previously in various forums, the issue of the upgrade to the building and the facilities contained therein, continues to move forward. Whilst progress seems at best slow, at worst non-existent, let me assure you all

that the club is working hard on your behalf to maximise the opportunity in getting the best possible result. It is our aim to gain even further funding than what has been pledged thus far. It is not an easy process and at times quite a battle, even to get an ear of an appropriate representative, let alone commitments of further funds, but we will persist.

We are all acutely aware of the issues around Lum Reserve, including the change rooms, the ground lighting, or lack thereof, and most importantly, at the moment anyway, the playing surface itself. We have been in constant contact with Council in recent weeks to address all of these issues and we will continue to do so. Our first priority is to ensure the playing surface is safe and suitable enough to continue playing on game days. Part of the issue there is the lack of lighting distribution around the ground. This inevitably leads to training being concentrated in a few small and confined areas. To that end, we have a meeting with Council at Lum Reserve early next week in a bid to try to gain some extra lighting, or at least improve what is already in place. It has been quite a wet season thus far and Lum Reserve simply hasn't coped. A negatively contributing factor is the lack of drainage, particularly at the car park end of the ground. Council had planned to do some repair work some weeks ago but that didn't eventuate. We will continue to advocate on behalf of our players and families and will keep you updated as we go. Currently, we have all teams training at Columbia Reserve until further notice. With that in mind, please be mindful and accommodating of other teams that may be sharing the ground with you at any given time.

Something that can assist us as a club to improve our facilities generally, is to ensure we treat them with respect and keep them in as good a condition as possible. That includes the surrounds at each ground. Recently, we have had Council relay to us some concerns from residents about the amount of rubbish left at the venues, around the ground and buildings, after games have concluded. Whilst we have asked for additional bins etc in a bid to alleviate such issues, it weakens our position considerably when asking for consideration for improvements at both venues. We understand that it is not always in our control as we have many visitors to each venue, but what we can do is be mindful to encourage everyone to do the right thing with rubbish and the general tidiness of the rooms after each game. We appreciate your understanding and assistance.

On a really positive note, last week's 'After Match' was a beauty. It was hosted by the Under 9 Families and it was great to see a really good turn up from our under 9 Boys and Girls teams. The Baked Potatoes were a smash hit. Many thanks to Bec Coutts and her band of merry cooks and servers for catering on the night. Also to the Families, many of which are new to the club, for making the night a huge success. It was a great chance for the rest of the club to see the latest crop of up and coming young Hawk players. It was fitting that the weekly meat Raffle was won by Jamie Haebich, who is the Team manager for the under 9 Brown team. This week sees the Under 11 group step up to the hosting plate. Fortunately for us, the Under 11 group has the Hickey family involved and more directly, they have kindly donated genuine 'Grill'd' burgers for this week's 'After Match', courtesy of their 'Grill'd' store in Acland Street, St.Kilda. Womens Level 0 Coaching Course




