Youth (U13-U19): Secondary School-aged children, 13-19 years. Develop player potential, enhance team skills and foster competitive spirit and desirable attitudes through training and match play.

- 1. To recognise the significant contribution of coaches to the conduct and development of Australian Football in Victoria and in particular in the Oakleigh Region
- 2. To recognise the achievements of coaches who give quality service to the game in that they:

  - 2.2 Foster enthusiasm for, interest in, and an excellent attitude to participation in football
  - 2.3 Give quality value to the goals and purposes of Club and League football.
