Please note: the club will turn off the ground lights during the presentations and all players must return to the club rooms. No players are to remain on the ground whilst the lights are off.

BlueQ

A big thank you to the 150+ parent volunteers who take on weekly roles within our 20 teams at the Waverley Park Hawks!!

As you are aware the SMJFL require a number of these weekly roles to have Working With Children Checks (WWCC) as well as other minimum qualifications for certain roles, e.g., a Level 1 coaching certificate is required to be a coach and/or assistant coach. These requirements are being monitored and audited by the league via BlueQ.

Currently, our compliance is at 62%, we need it approaching 100% by this weekend.

Those in roles that require a WWCC and/or other qualifications should have added your qualifications to your BlueQ profile. If you haven't then you would have been receiving reminder emails from BlueQ. If you are receiving BlueQ e-mails, could you please take a couple of minutes to log in (<u>www.blueq.com.au</u>), check your details and add in your qualifications.

The following outlines the minimum requirements for each role.

Coaches and Assistant Coaches:

- Working With Children Check (exemption for children Under 18 only)
- Minimum of AFL Coaching Accreditation Level 1 Junior Coach

Trainers:

- AFL Emergency Response Coordinator (13+ only)
- Provide First Aid HLTAID003 (all ages)
- Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation HLTAID001 (all ages)
- Working With Children Check (all ages, exemption for children Under 18 only)

The following roles all need to have WWCC (exemption for children Under 18 only):

- Runner
- Team Manager
- Club Volunteer Umpire
- Umpire Escort (non-modified rules)

For those that have applied for WWCC and not yet received your card or have completed courses but not yet received your certificate, please add the qualification to your BlueQ profile and attach a copy of the receipt to the qualification as evidence for compliance purposes.

Consumption of Alcohol at Training and on Match Day

It has been brought to the club's attention that some unidentified members of our club have been consuming alcohol whilst watching training and during games. This is a breach of the club's liquor license, is not a good look for a junior football club and it is an offence to consume alcohol in a public place such as Columbia Park and Lum Reserve.

In addition, it is against SMJFL rules to consume alcohol on match day and a club was sanctioned earlier in the season by the league for a breach of the league's by-law:

37.1. Consumption of alcohol by any person in any form at a ground (including surrounding areas) or building during SMJFL scheduled matches is strictly prohibited and will be dealt with at the discretion of the General Manager. The consumption of alcohol during training sessions is strongly discouraged.

Any member of the club that is found to be drinking during training or on match day will face disciplinary action from the club.

To assist us with this matter, if you see any member of the club drinking at training or during games, please advise a member of the club's executive.

Do Not Use Window Shutters at Lum Reserve

There is an issue with the window shutters at Lum Reserve that sees them regularly jam in the open position. Council is aware of the problem and has organized for the shutters to be repaired and/or replaced.

In the interim can all teams/members refrain from using them until further notice.
