#### **Columbia Park Pavilion Update**

As you are aware the expectations of the club were that redevelopment of the Columbia Park pavilion would have commenced about now. Unfortunately, the tender process and evaluation has taken a lot longer than Council expected. At this stage, a report to appoint a contractor will go to the August Council meeting. In making that appointment Council will set a start date and construction period for the contractor. Given the above timeframe, the earliest the club can expect the re-development to commence is now September.

Council will shortly be meeting with club representatives to discuss the revised project timeline and any impact this may have on the 2018 season generated from the delay of the tender process.

#### Lum Reserve – Crowd Behaviour

The Committee needs to bring to the attention of all our players, families, and supporters some important information regarding Lum Reserve and our club's use of the facility.

As you are no doubt aware, Lum Reserve is our secondary facility after Columbia Park, but is important to our week to week operations, and being able to accommodate our 20 teams. We are fortunate to be able to have the use of both facilities.

To that end, it is unfortunate that a few issues have been identified as occurring whilst games have been played at Lum Reserve. The club generally has a good relationship with both the Monash Council and local residents surrounding our two facilities. The issues range from excessive activity in and around a particular area of Lum Reserve, to rocks and debris being thrown over the fences of adjoining houses, to both children and even an adult, urinating against fences of those properties, whilst behind the cover of the garden located in that position. The problem area is the west side of the ground where the elevated garden bed and retaining wall are located, adjacent to the new coaches' boxes.

It is important that we are both appreciative of the ability to use the facility as well as us respecting those residents and their properties around Lum Reserve.

The Committee is asking all players, families and supporters to refrain from standing on that side of the ground during games. It is our preference that ONLY players and officials remain on that side of the ground during game times. We are asking Team Managers and Coaches to be vigilant with their various teams/groups in a bid to assist. We would ask that whilst at Lum Reserve, those not directly involved as a player or official, remain either on the eastern, or pavilion side, or behind the goal are at either end.

We are in consultation with Council around measures to assist, such as signage etc, and will be corresponding with all other visiting clubs via the SMJFL, to create the necessary awareness of this approach.

We are not apportioning blame in any direction, internal or otherwise, but more trying to avoid any reoccurrence in the future.

The Committee appreciates your cooperation and please don't hesitate to contact a committee member should you need any assistance or clarification.

#### New Scoreboard Software

Some of you may have noticed the electronic scoreboard at Columbia Park looked a little different last round – this is because the club has had new software (and hardware) installed to provide greater functionality and improved ease of use.

The club felt the previous software was limited in its functionality and at times difficult to use. We believe the new software is simple to use (even by occasional/casual users), yet provides a lot more scoreboard functionality as well as the ability to display live camera feeds, DVDs, live free-to-air TV and videos. These features will provide greater exposure for our sponsors and supporters of the club and enable the club to consider events based around the scoreboard such as an outdoor theatre night or perhaps an AFL Grand Final day event watching the game on the scoreboard.
